

# Get Free Nurse Social Worker Collaboration In Managed Care A Model Of Community Case Management

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Objectives: To examine the impact of an interdisciplinary, collaborative practice intervention involving a primary care physician, a nurse, and a social worker for community-dwelling seniors with chronic illnesses. Methods: A concurrent, controlled cohort study of 543 patients in 18 private office practices of primary care physicians was conducted.

This office-based intervention, described previously, 18 demanded close collaboration among a PCP, a registered nurse with geriatrics training, and a master's-prepared clinical social worker experienced in working with seniors and their emotional health concerns. Each full-time nurse and half-time social worker divided his or her time among 3 intervention physicians whose individual practices were located in 1 San Francisco Bay-area county.

The results are explained from the perspective of critical social theory. Conclusions: Reports exist on collaboration between nurses and social workers in the care of older people showing that it can be beneficial both for recipients of care and carers, although few articles were identified.
